EVENTS & PERFORMANCES

The Rock to the Future Student House Band performed at the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in Cleveland, Arts and Business Council Awards, Arts Sanctuary Celebration of Black Artists, Project Home's Memorial Service, The Food Trust Night Market, Pennypack Park, Rubaroo, Trenton Ave Arts Festival, the Philadelphia Film Society Movies on the Block, New Church Live, Clark Park Festival, and opened for the Philly POPS at the Kimmel Center.

All MusiCore students participated in a Holiday Showcase in December held at Rock to the Future headquarters and Year End Showcase in June held at World Cafe Live. All summer camp students participates in camp end showcases held at Rock to the Future. All performances are always open to the public and free when held at Rock to the Future. Each MobileMusic class also had a one or more performances.

Rock to the Future also held an annual gala-style fundraiser - The Music for All Ball - as well as an annual donor appreciation party held on #GivingTuesday.

MUSICORE AFTER SCHOOL 35 STUDENTS

MusiCore provides individualized music instruction, social support, and academic support. Youth in grades 6 - 12 from dozens of schools in Philadelphia attend daily to write original music, learn an instrument, play in a band, and receive homework help and college application support (plus other music activities). MusiCore is free and for lower-income Philly youth.

MOBILEMUSIC

Group classes that take place directly in-schools or at partner locations. Partners from 2015 - 2016 were Hackett Elementary School, Conwell Middle School, St. Martin's de Porres, Philadelphia Montesorri, String Theory High School, and Philadelphia READS! summer Camps. Each site included live performances for family, friends, and peers.

GuitarStars (ages 7 - 11) and Rock*A*Delphia (ages 12 - 17) are week long summer camps. Youth receive group lessons, attend creative workshops, and write original music with their bands. Students perform their original music live at the end of camp. Most students (90%) attend camp at no cost.

350 STUDENTS

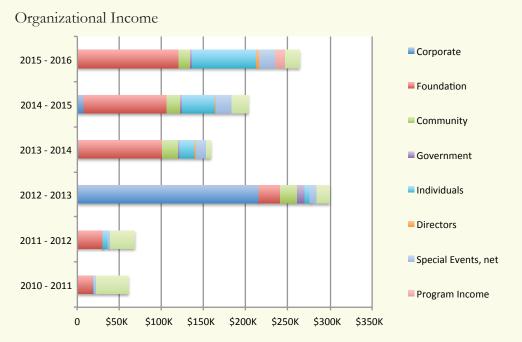

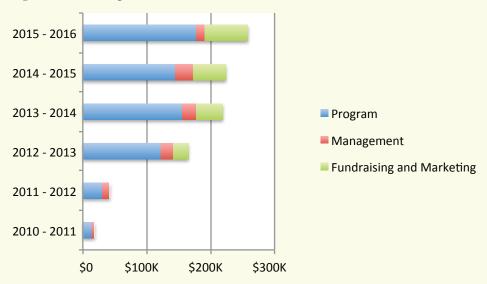
